We wrote to you previously in April this year when we began the next stage in the preparation of the Derbyshire and Derby Minerals Local Plan – a consultation to engage the wider community of Derbyshire and Derby in helping us to develop the vision, objectives, strategies and policies of the future Minerals Local Plan.

We are grateful to those who have already provided comments, which we have started to consider, and are in the process of amending the papers to take them into account. We have also added a number of papers since the consultation began and a number have now been added, including a paper on Hydrocarbons (including Hydraulic Fracturing). Papers on the draft Vision and Objectives and the Sand and Gravel Site Methodology and Assessments will be added at the end of November. We are now inviting comments on all papers, but particularly on the papers that have been added, until 31st January 2016.

We look forward to hearing from you. All your comments and suggestions will be used to inform the draft Plan, on which we will seek further views next year, before it is published and then examined by an independent Inspector in 2017.

Summer Holiday Provision – Monday 25th July to Friday 26th August 2016

Following the hugely successful Summer Activities in 2015 which attracted approximately 7,500 participations, we are now planning for summer 2016. I am writing to offer your Parish the opportunity to book the mobile sports and activity provisions to visit you during the summer holidays running from 25th July 2016 – 26th August 2016. Due to the mid-week split of the first week of the school holidays, and many schools taking inset training days at the beginning of the week, we will be offering evening provision only for the first 2 days of the week beginning 25th July. From the 27th July onwards we will be offering a comprehensive five weeks of activity that we hope you will want to bring to the young people and families in your Parish.

Following the success of the SportMobile provision that was provided as an alternative to the climbing wall sessions towards the end of the summer, we have decided to offer this as an afternoon and evening provision on a couple of days per week. This proved popular among families and allowed parents that worked during the day to join in and enjoy activities with their children. Due to a review of equipment the climbing wall will not be offered as a provision this year, however with the imminent opening of the Apex Climbing Centre at Green Bank Leisure Centre we will be offering prizes and opportunities for participants attending the summer provision to potentially win a free session at this exciting new venue. For those who want a climbing experience into the future they will be able to do so at the Apex.

The exciting mobile provisions available for 2016 are:

- **Sports & Health Olympic Mobile: Including...** (Aimed at 8-16 year olds under 5's can attend with a responsible adult at all times.)

- **Play Mobile: including...** (Aimed at 8-12 years under 5's can attend with a responsible adult at all times.)
Bouncing Castle
Giant games
Age appropriate kit: Hula Hoops, Skipping ropes, soft balls (aimed at the younger age group)
Olympic themed arts and crafts
- **Wheels Mobile: Including...** (Aimed at 8-16 year olds under 5's can attend with a responsible adult at all times.)
Early rider, balance and mountain bikes
Bike ramps and courses
Pogo stick
Scooters and KMX karts
- **Friday only booking: an extended session from 1-4pm with the following provisions included.** (Aimed at 8-16 year olds, families encouraged, under 5's can attend with a responsible adult at all times.)

Play Mobile
Laser games kit – Laser combat guns, inflatable obstacles,
Community alternative games kit – tug of war, relay races, skipping, welly throwing, tyre rolling and skittles.

As ever we are currently reviewing all of our kit and are in the process of purchasing new and exciting equipment and activities to supplement the main attraction on all of our mobile units. Our current kit will undergo its Health and Safety testing in the New Year to ensure it meets regulation standards. Should there be any kit that needs replacing we will endeavor to do so for "like for like" kit. However should this affect your provision booking in any way we will contact you.

Activity leaders will supply and set up the equipment and then supervise all sessions. All activity leaders will have Disclosure Barring Scheme (DBS) clearance. Public liability insurance is provided by South Derbyshire District Council (SDDC).

To ensure the security of parish sites are maintained we would like to remind parishes of the importance of having a member of the Parish present to open and secure the facility prior to the provisions arrival and immediately after the provision has departed, to ensure no unauthorized access to the site is possible either before or after the session.

Costs for a 2 hour delivery session, with the set up and take down of half an hour either side of delivery time are listed below. (Please note VAT is applicable in addition to the prices below).

Please note: pricing is subject to South Derbyshire District Council committee approval.

I have enclosed the relevant booking form, which should be completed and returned to me, along with contact details of **two people** who will be available when provisions are scheduled to attend should I need to contact you.

We are committed to delivering a service in your area whatever the weather. Should the parish have a suitable indoor area available for us to use in the case of inclement weather, please add this to the reverse of the booking form so it can be promoted in our advertising material. Please note details of requirements in the guidance notes.

Provision will be allocated on a first come first served basis. The deadline for summer bookings is **Friday 5th February 2016**. In order to check that your requested dates are available before returning your form, or if you have any queries, please phone Emma Pass on 01283 595873. Please note that bookings will not be confirmed until the official booking form is returned to me by post or e-mail at the address on the top of this letter and after the booking deadline. Should there be a problem with any of the dates you request, I will call you to discuss alternative options.

Invoices will be sent out to Parish Councils in October 2016 for any sessions they have had during the summer. If a session is cancelled due to adverse weather conditions or due to no young people attending, a full charge will still be made. If the provision is unable to attend due to vehicle breakdown, staff shortages or equipment failure then no charge will be made.

Finally, I would like to remind you that in order for the activities to start on time, Parish Councils must ensure the allocated location is accessible at least 30 minutes prior to the start time. If the area is inaccessible, the provision will not run and a full charge will still be made. I look forward to working with you and hearing from you in the near future.

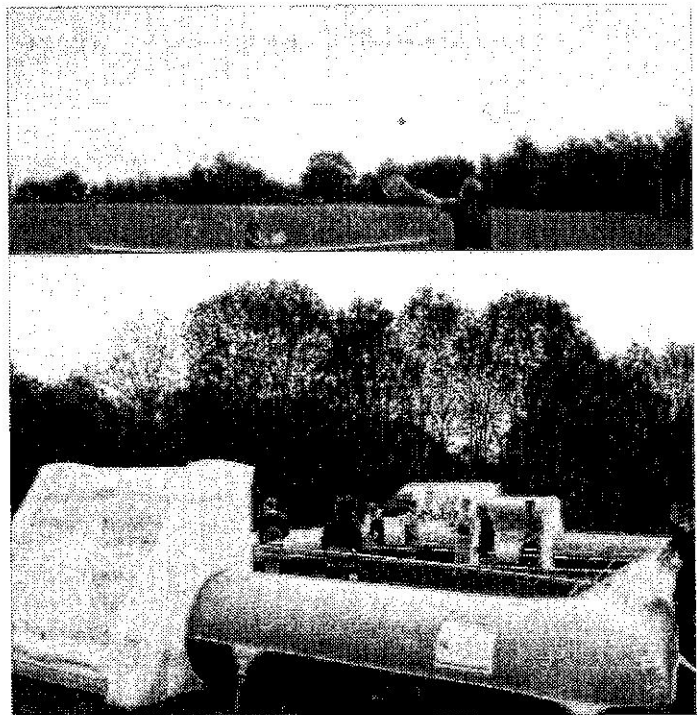
Olympic Mobile

Back following popular demand, 2016 will see the Olympic sports van. Hoping to inspire the National as the Olympics take place in Rio, Brazil, The Olympic Mobile will contain the Inflatable Human Table Football Area.

The Sports Mobile will contain a range of sports kit. Suitable for all ages and abilities including:-

- Football
- Cricket
- Tag Rugby
- Rounders
- Tennis
- Basketball
- Badminton

The Human Table Football Arena will act as an enclosed space in which young people can play all different types of sport from football, uni-hockey, handball, ultimate Frisbee and many more.



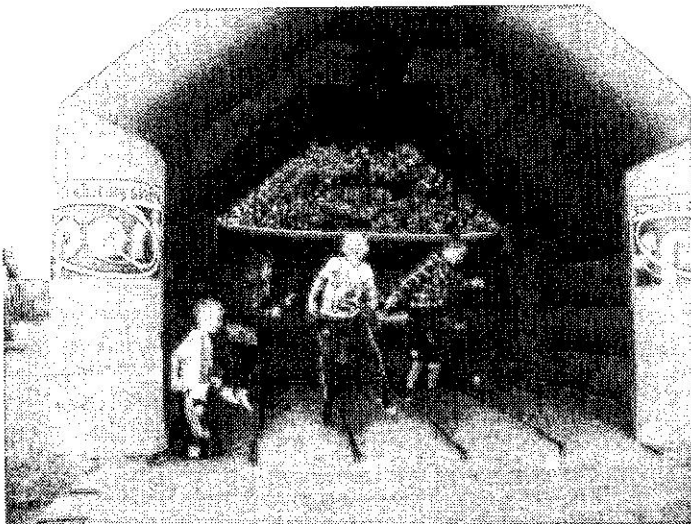
Laser Games

- The outdoor laser combat arena is made up of inflatable barricades, obstacles, cargo nets and tunnels for the participants to dodge, duck and hide behind whilst using the latest digital laser guns to ensure they experience the ultimate laser combat experience.
- Introducing a bigger and better arena for 2016 with guest appearances of our giant inflatable alien.
- 2016 sees the addition of laser games such as capture the flag. Players can also take part in either a team or solo situation for 5 to 10 minute games to see who comes out as the sharpest shooter.
- The Laser Games will only be available in 2016 for the Big Fun Friday events.
- The combat arena cannot be used when the surface is wet or when it is raining as it can endanger the participants. This decision is to be made solely by the operators of the provision.
- The combat arena can only be used on a suitable site. A suitable site is defined as a flat grassed surface, free from any debris (e.g. glass / stones), free from pot holes, having no slopes that are deemed to inhibit the safety of the participants, and the grassed area needs to be 40m x 40m.



Play Mobile

- The Play Mobile is a provision that contains a range of play and craft activities and is ideal for engaging a younger age group in a wide variety of activities.
- The Bouncy Castle which will accompany this provision is bigger and bouncier than previous years!
- The Play Mobile can be set up outdoors with arts and craft type activities along with more active activities such as: space hopper races, jumping sack races, parachute and circus games, giant jenga, giant snakes and ladders and giant connect four.
- Added extras include tri golf equipment, early riders and pogo sticks!
- In the case of bad weather some of the provision carried in the van can be used indoors, if an indoor site such as a village hall is adjacent to the recreation area is available. However this does mean that some of the provision will not be used.
- When the unit is used outdoors, the area needs to be suitable. A suitable site is defined as: a flat grassed surface, free from any debris (e.g. glass / stones), free from pot holes, having no slope that is deemed to inhibit the safety of the participants, and the grassed area needs to be at least 20m x 20m.



Wheels Mobile

- One of the coolest provisions we have to travel South Derbyshire! The Wheels Mobile gives young people the chance to experience weird and wonderful wheeled activities that people may never get the chance to use anywhere else.
- Equipment includes the KMX karts, which have proven to be very popular with young people. KMX karts are three wheeled high performance sports trikes that are part go kart, part BMX. The KMX Karts come in two sizes and are fully adjustable to cater for young people from the ages 6 and over.
- The Wheels Mobile will also include Street Surfing boards, Mini Scooters and Skateboards. The Street Surfing boards combine the natural fluidity of surfing with the smooth maneuverability of snowboarding and skating.
- Safety equipment such as pads and helmets will be provided to the participants. Under 8s must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- The Wheels Mobile can only be used on a suitable site. A suitable site is defined as: a flat tarmac surface, free from any debris (e.g. glass / stones), free from pot holes, having no slope that is deemed to inhibit the safety of the participants, and the tarmac area is a size similar to a tennis court (smaller / larger areas can be used although this affects the amount of equipment that can be used). The mountain bike challenge requires short grass, free from debris as shown in picture.
- The Wheels Mobile cannot be used when the surface is wet or when it is raining as it can endanger the participants. This decision is to be made solely by the operators of the wheels mobile.





Big Fun Friday

The big Fun Friday event is an extended session that runs from 1pm-4pm on Friday afternoons.
